**INTRODUCTION**

This is the Chair's report to the Clinical Commissioning Group Board following the October 2017 Primary Care Commissioning Committee.

**GOVERNANCE**

The Commissioning Lead – Primary Care presented a work-plan for the Committee which was noted.

**STRATEGY**

The Head of Primary Care advised the Committee on progress in implementing the CCG's Primary Care "Blueprint":


- The number of contracts had reduced from 55 to 40 in the period 2 years since October 2015
- 35 out of 40 practices in Hull have come together into 5 groupings in response to the CCG invitation to submit proposals at scale for utilisation of the primary care transformational monies.
- The CCG had received resource from the NHS England Estates and Transformation Fund to implement e-consult within practices. In addition a number of submissions had been made to support estates development (new build and reconfiguration).

An integrated estates mapping and planning tool was presented which had been developed to support estates mapping across health and the local authority.

The Committee considered and declined an application to close a practice list and also received updates on the NHS England Clinical Pharmacists in general practice scheme, the GP Career Plus Scheme, the international GP recruitment scheme and the NHS Charging Policy and Project 600.

**SYSTEM DEVELOPMENT & IMPLEMENTATION**

The Chief Finance Officer updated the Committee on the CCG's Integrated Delivery Framework and Local Quality Premium Scheme. The Chief Finance Officer and CCG Chair were given delegated authority to refine the scheme.
