

**PRIMARY CARE COMMISSIONING COMMITTEE
MEETING HELD ON 27TH AUGUST 2017
CHAIR'S UPDATE REPORT
PART 1**

INTRODUCTION

This is the Chair's report to the Clinical Commissioning Group Board following the August 2017 Primary Care Commissioning Committee.

Strategy

The Head of Primary Care advised the Committee that definite progress was being made with developing primary care at scale with 5 practice groupings having been established, each covering over 30,000 patients.

It was noted that 5 practices remain unattached to groupings and the Local Medical Committee (LMC) continued to support them.

It was noted that there was good representation at the June 2017 Primary Care Medical Services Provider Forum (PCMSPF) with it being apparent that practices were working together. The Chair of NHS Hull CCG had shared the thinking and working around the Integrated Delivery Framework which was being undertaken.

Primary Care Update

The Oaks Medical centre had requested a 12 month list closure, Committee Members were not supportive of closing the list for 12 months and agreed a 6 month closure after which a progress report would be received and a possible application for extension.

Kingston Health Centre had requested to reduce their boundary size. The Committee agreed to reduce the boundary to new registrations to HU3 for Wheeler Street and HU9 for Park Health Centre.

East Hull Family Practice / The Shaikh Partnership after appropriate consultation with patients and councillors and subsequent virtual approval from Primary Care Commissioning Committee the Savoy Road Surgery closed on 31.07.17.

A request from Dr Cook to change the practice boundary for Field View Surgery was approved that due to increasing workload and patient demand and grouping work with transformational monies.

City Health Care Partnership (CHCP) CIC had signed a contract to deliver the 1 year GP Career Plus national pilot scheme.

Templars recruitment agency has been appointed to work with the CCGs in the STP as part of the International GP Recruitment Scheme which aims to recruit 65 GP's across the STP area with 19 posts having been identified by practices in Hull.
