# 1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this report is to present the Primary Care Commissioning Committee with the revised Local Quality Premium Scheme for 2018/19 for approval.

# 2. BACKGROUND

The meeting of the Primary Care Commissioning Committee held in March 2018 received a paper which presented the CCG's Integrated Delivery Framework and Local Quality Premium scheme for general practice groupings for 2018/19. The scheme had three sections as follows:

- Managing Need
- Chronic Disease Management
- Primary Care Data Quality

The scheme was considered at the meeting and a number of comments were made. The scheme has been further developed in the light of these comments and a revised version is attached.
