FAITH HOUSE, NEWLAND GROUP & NEW HALL SURGERIES - ENGAGEMENT REPORT

1 INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this report is to update the Primary Care Commissioning Committee on the outcome of the engagement work undertaken by Modality Hull in relation to a proposal to reconfigure services delivered from Faith House, Newland Group and New Hall surgeries.

2 BACKGROUND

Following the Primary Care Commissioning Committee approval in October 2018 of the engagement plan proposed by Modality Hull in relation to services delivered by three of their practices in the west of the city papers were taken to the Hull City Council Health & Wellbeing Overview and Scrutiny Commission and the North Area Committee in November 2018 to outline the proposals and engagement plan. A GP from Modality Hull Division attended both meetings along with the CCG Associate Director of Communications and Engagement and Strategic Lead - Primary Care.

The Modality Hull patient engagement exercise in relation to the proposed changes commenced in mid-December and ran until 31st January 2019 with postal responses received until mid-February 2019. An interim report on the engagement was also taken by Modality Hull to the North Area Committee in January 2019.

3 ENGAGEMENT OUTCOME

Following the end of the engagement work Modality Hull have formally confirmed their next steps in the letter attached as Appendix 1.
