#### 1 INTRODUCTION

There is a requirement for every Health and Care Partnership / Integrated Care System to submit to NHS England a fully signed off Primary Care Strategy by 31st July 2019.

## 3 HUMBER COAST & VALE STRATEGY DEVELOPMENT

In 2017/18 every STP across the North Region was asked to develop and submit GPFV delivery plans highlighting how the various requirements would be delivered over the five years of the programme.

The attached Humber Coast & Vale Healthcare Partnership Primary Care Strategy 2019 - 24 has built on the ambitions and vision described in the Health and Care Partnership Primary Care Delivery Plan to achieve and exceed the commitments made in all key recent publications, Long Term Plan, GPFV, GP Partnership Review, and the GP Contract Reforms.

The Humber Coast & Vale Primary Care Programme Board discussed and made recommendations on the Strategy at its meeting on 30th May 2019 and the final strategy was approved for submission to NHS England at the Humber Coast & Vale Health and Care Partnership Executive Group on 12<sup>th</sup> June 2019.
