

**PRIMARY CARE COMMISSIONING COMMITTEE
MEETING HELD ON 28 JUNE 2019
CHAIR'S UPDATE REPORT
PART 1**

INTRODUCTION

This is the Chair's report to the Clinical Commissioning Group Board following the June 2019 Primary Care Commissioning Committee.

GOVERNANCE

There were no items of Governance considered by the Committee.

STRATEGY

The Committee noted the proposed mergers of East Hull Family Practice with Dr Malczewski and Dr GM Chowdhury, and a number of updates in relation to the implementation of MJOG messaging and the proposed new west Hull primary care facility.

The Committee considered a proposal from Modality Hull to relocate and consolidate the provision of general practice services delivered from the Faith House, New Hall and Alexandra Road surgery sites to New Hall and Alexandra Road surgeries. The Committee considered the engagement report and it was acknowledged that this had been extensive. It was also noted that the engagement report findings had been presented to the Health & Wellbeing Overview and Scrutiny Commission. The changes in GP and the wider primary care workforce that had occurred at Modality Hull were noted and the impact of this on delivery of services was recognised.

The Committee approved the request to relocate and consolidate the provision of general practice services delivered from the Faith House, New Hall and Alexandra Road surgery sites to New Hall and Alexandra Road surgeries.

The Committee received and considered the Humber Coast and Vale Primary Care Strategy.

SYSTEM DEVELOPMENT & IMPLEMENTATION

The Committee received an update confirming that the Humber Coast and Vale Primary Care Programme Board had approved the 5 proposed Primary Care Networks in Hull.

The Committee approved allocation of resources to support the provision of a clinical decision support system for practices in Hull for an initial 2 year period and the continuation of the Community Frailty local quality scheme for a further 3 months.
