










WHO IS THIS COURSE FOR?

Whether you are looking to progress into employment or onto a university course, the broad nature of BTEC Health and Social Care at advanced level will not lock you into any particular direction and will give you the background knowledge to pursue a variety of career pathways. There are many opportunities for suitably qualified students to train to become nurses, midwives, social workers, physiotherapists, residential care and child care professionals as well as the allied technical specialists supporting these professions.

Many jobs will accept students with Health and Social Care qualifications direct from college. Former students have progressed from the advanced level in Health and Social Care to employment and higher education. Recent degree courses taken by former students include; Adult Nursing, Mental Health Nursing, Midwifery, Children's Nursing, Learning Disability Nursing, Children's Inter Professional Studies, Primary Teaching, Childhood/Child Studies, Health Studies, Social Science Studies, Social Work, Sociology, Care and Education Guidance and Counselling, Paramedic Science, Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy and Operating Department Practice.

COURSE CONTENT

The BTEC Level 3 in Health and Social Care is available in four forms:

BTEC LEVEL 3 CERTIFICATE (1/2 A LEVEL EQUIVALENT)

All the content of the Certificate qualification is mandatory and is based on the person-centred approach and values needed to work in the health and social care sector. The mandatory units focus on:

- Developing effective communication in Health and Social Care:
- Equality, diversity and rights in Health and Social Care
- Development through the life stages.

BTEC LEVEL 3 SUBSIDIARY DIPLOMA (1 A LEVEL EQUIVALENT)

Consists of six units and may be delivered over one or two academic years. The units include:

- Developing effective communication in Health and Social Care-
- Equality, diversity and rights in Health and Social Care;
- Health, safety and security in Health and Social Care:
- Development through the life stages;
- Anatomy and physiology for Health and Social Care; and
- Physiological disorders.

BTEC LEVEL 3 DIPLOMA (2 A LEVEL EQUIVALENT)

Includes 12 units and is delivered over two academic years. The 12 units include the six shown above for the Subsidiary Diploma course plus:

- *Personal and professional development in Health and Social Care;
- Sociological perspectives for Health and Social Care;
- Psychological perspectives for Health and Social Care;
- Caring for children and young people;
- Safeguarding adults and promoting independence; and
- Research Methods in Health and Social Care.

LEVEL 3 EXTENDED DIPLOMA (3 A LEVEL EQUIVALENT)


Includes the Diploma units plus:

- Anatomy and Physiology for Health and Social Care:
- Nutritional Health;
- Promoting Health Education:
- Infection Prevention and Control;
- Caring for Individuals with Additional Needs; and
- Caring for Individuals with Dementia.
- *Work experience in Health and Social Care requires 100 hours of vocationally relevant work experience to be completed over the duration of the course. This is achieved through two work experience placements, of a two week duration in each academic year.

A clear need: It is estimated that in the next 5 years, we, in this area will need another 50,000 new health care workers to replace those that will be retiring
