Rapid Health Needs Assessment – COVID-19 recovery

1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this item is to ensure that the Board are aware of and sighted on the intelligence work that is being undertaken to support the recovery from and response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

2. BACKGROUND

NHS providers nationally, in response to the need to release critical care capacity as a result of the initial response to COVID-19, dramatically reduced their elective care delivery. There is a need to better understand the potential impacts of this temporary change in the delivery of care on the population of Hull. In addition, there are likely to be unanticipated consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic on non-COVID conditions.
