

**PRIMARY CARE COMMISSIONING COMMITTEE
MEETING HELD ON JUNE 25TH 2021
CHAIR'S UPDATE REPORT**

Part One

INTRODUCTION

This is the Chair's report to the Clinical Commissioning Group Board following the June 2021 Primary Care Commissioning Committee.

GOVERNANCE

The Committee approved a proposal to continue with the existing terms of reference as there were no "business critical" amendments required. The Committee received and endorsed the Chair's Annual Report covering the period April 2020 - March 2021.

STRATEGY

The Committee received various NHS England updates including:

- Revised General Practice Standard Operating Procedure
- The GP COVID Expansion Fund
- The Humber Coast and Vale (HCV) 2021/22 Operating Plan
- PCN support roles

The Committee considered a section 96 payment to the Newland Medical Centre and declined to approve a payment.

The Committee received the six monthly Primary Care Communications and Engagement Plan update.

SYSTEM DEVELOPMENT & IMPLEMENTATION


The Committee approved the specifications and tariffs for the 12 lead Electrocardiogram service and Prostate Cancer PSA Monitoring/Active Surveillance and Follow-Up services to be commissioned as part of the extended Primary Care Medical Services.

The Committee received the risk register report and approved recommendations to reduce risk ratings for risk 957 and 930.

The Committee received the Finance Report and approved utilisation of PMS Premium resources to continue to support a Clinical Decision Support System for general practices

The Committee received a report presenting the primary care section of the HCV Operating Plan 2021/22.

The Committee received a report from the Medical Director of Humberside LMCs which explored the experiences and impact of racism and discrimination experienced by staff in primary care. It was agreed that further work would be undertaken collaboratively with the LMC and Primary Care Networks.
