## 1 Delegation of Primary Medical Care Services

In preparation for the establishment of the Integrated Care Board (ICB) on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2022 NHS England/Improvement together with the Integrated Care System (ICS) have established a Primary Care Group to support the safe transfer of delegation for Primary Medical Care Services from Clinical Commissioning Groups to the ICB.

As part of the January 2022 Statement of Readiness Submission the ICB will be required to confirm assurance against the following questions:-

- The ICB is clear on the requirements of the Primary Care Medical Services contract.
- The ICB is prepared for adopting full delegated commissioning of the primary medical care function from CCGs i.e. Governance arrangements - joint committees, financial flow etc.
- The financial implications and risks for the ICB are understood.
- The staffing capacity and capability required by the ICB to cover the management of the new contract is in place.

The Primary Care Group will oversee the process to ensure that the ICB can demonstrate its readiness to operate.

The Primary Care Group is Chaired by Julie Warren who will oversee the process and will be supported by:-

- A sub group to support the governance arrangements for decisions to be taken at the most appropriate level.
- A sub group to review capacity across the system to manage delegation
- A sub group to oversee the financial position across the system

An overarching action log is tracking progress and will be used to identify any risks and issues.

#### 2 Delegation of Pharmacy, Optometry and Dental

The ICB will take on full delegation of the other 3 contractor groups on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2023 and the process outlined above will be mirrored working with NHS E/I to safely transfer the commissioning of these services.
